

Outfitted for Success



Sister Thea Bowman Day in Utica

Mayor Robert Palmieri joined our children and families on February 12, 2020, as he issued a proclamation announcing Sister Thea Bowman Day in Utica, NY. The celebration included the children's choir as they performed "This Little Light of Mine" gospel style. The teens joined the kindergarten and first graders as they presented the life of Sister Thea through a child's eyes. We took the name of this great woman for our center because she was the embodiment of the kind of unconditional love or *agape*, that we hoped to embrace in our mission statement.

Sister Thea promoted multi-cultural education as a teacher, and she used her gifts of music, song and poetry to encourage her own African American people to celebrate their heritage and to be proud of being their true selves. Her 52 years on earth were spent well as she taught us to live every day to the fullest.

The event ended with the unveiling of our new logo, which makes a simple yet profound image of children of all races, religions, and cultures in a circle with a heart full of love at the center.

New Life at the DeSales Center

You may have heard about the Academics First Child Care Center that hopes to open its doors on the ground floor of the four story DeSales Center. The goal is to provide 24/7 child care to help those parents who work nights and weekends.

The former St. Francis deSales School is reliving its original mission of education and care of children. Thea Bowman House now occupies the first and second floors of the building with 160 pre-kindergarten and over 100 school aged children.

Handicap accessibility has been a growing need. Currently programs are limited in their ability to serve children and adults with disabilities. It also keeps us from using the top floor. We will soon be announcing a campaign to install an elevator and some desperately needed replacement windows.

There will be a kick-off event in the spring. Please help us spread the word.

Donor advised grants from the Community Foundation of Herkimer and Oneida Counties supplied some needed furnishings for the much larger space.
